

Volunteer Achievement Awards from the Mayor of London

A quick reminder the deadline for nominations is approaching, nominations close on 21 July 2017



Now's the time to nominate your volunteers for an award from the Mayor of London as part of the Team London 2017 Achievement Awards – nominations close on 21 July 2017.

Volunteers can be nominated across a broad range of categories that seek to capture the full diversity of London's volunteering community, with awards for volunteers under 25, volunteers over 25, and people who volunteer in a team. The winners will be presented with their award at the prestigious ceremony at City Hall in the autumn.

The Team London Awards 2017 will be distributed in the following categories:

- Environment & Healthy Living Award
 - greening & cleaning, regeneration, sustainability, food growing, nutrition, air pollution activities and any other activity that improves the environment or healthy living
- Skills & Development Award
 - mentoring, coaching, befriending, training, advice sessions, sharing of information that brings positive impact to the community

- Community Engagement Award
 - all forms of community engagement, outreach, integration and volunteering activities aimed at improving social cohesion in communities
- Sports Award
 - volunteering activity that brings benefit to communities through sport, increasing volunteers helping to run sports activities, increasing the reach of sport into new communities
- Uniformed Youth Groups Award
 - the volunteering work that young people undertake in their uniform groups or the adult volunteers who give their time to running the units
- Outstanding Commitment to Corporate Volunteering in the Community Award
 - a robust and wide-ranging volunteering/CSR programme which has been in place for at least three years
- Innovative Corporate Volunteering in the Community Award
 - a long-term or very innovative volunteering project



The judges will be looking for volunteers who've shown outstanding enthusiasm and commitment, who've given exceptional service or contributed particular depth of experience, or who have achieved great impact through their volunteering.

Taking place as the Fundraising Regulator continues its work on implementing the Fundraising Preference Service and updating the Fundraising Code of Practice, delegates will consider the future for the fundraising sector.

Planned sessions focus on the developing role of the Fundraising Regulator in maintaining standards, as well as next steps for ensuring public trust in charities and developing technology to support fundraising.

It will also be an opportunity to consider key issues for charities in preparing for General Data Protection Regulation coming into effect in May 2018, with the Information Commissioner's Office planning to publish guidance on legitimate interest provisions later this year.

A quick and easy way to get small Lottery grants of between £300 and £10,000

Awards for All offers grants of between £300 and £10,000 for grassroots and community activity that aims to improve life for local people and neighbourhoods. It doesn't have a deadline and you can apply at any time.

It is our most popular grants programme so we will prioritise groups with smaller incomes. Due to high demand on the programme, organisations that have a large annual income may not be able to get funding through Awards for All.

We recommend you send us your application at least four months before you want your

project to start.

The GSK IMPACT Awards are open to registered charities that are at least three years old, working in a health-related field in the UK, and with a total annual income of between £80,000 and £2.5 million.

- Up to ten winners receive £30,000 plus the overall winner receives an extra £10,000.
- Up to ten runners-up receive £3,000.
- Award winners are offered free training and development valued at up to £6,000.
- You do not need to present a new project, and you decide how to spend the award money.
